



MONDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2016 Keynote Lecture 7:30 PM SENATOR JOSEPH LIEBERMAN

Following ordination, Bob served as Assistant Rabbi at Temple Beth Zion in Buffalo (where Herbert Tarr also began his rabbinate!) and went on to lead a Philadelphia synagogue before transitioning full-time to helping people laugh, which is the focus of his rabbinate.

Course #1

Title: *Jewish Prayer*
Instructor: Beile Block

What is Jewish prayer? Why do we pray? Is God listening? Does God care? Why do we need public worship and a prayer book? Doesn't God know what I am thinking? Join us to explore the origins and meaning of one of our most ancient practices.

Course #2

Title: *Cycling Through Life: A New Lens by Which to Examine our Jewish Life Cycle Events*
Instructor: Rabbi Deborah Bravo

Throughout this course, we will look particularly at the Jewish life cycle events around Birth, B'nai Mitzvah and Wedding. We will study the rituals pertaining to each of these events, old and new, and how we might bring covenant, mitzvah and meaning back into these ancient practices. We will particularly look at the role a parent and/or grandparent might play at each of these events.

Course #3

Title: *Kabbalah: What's the big secret?*
Instructor: Rabbi Irwin Huberman

Until recently, the sharing of Kabbalah, Jewish mysticism, was generally restricted to well educated married men over forty years of age with children. Why? In this series, we will explore the basics of Kabbalah, including its history, its core concepts and some of its most popular lessons and meditations.

Course #4

Title: *"Thank you Elie Wiesel!" The Impact of Elie Wiesel and His Writings*
Instructor: Rabbi Alan Lucas

The death of Elie Wiesel is an enormous loss for the Jewish people and for all humanity. As the years went on, Wiesel became larger than life, representing a moral voice in a world in which morality has been sadly lacking. He came to stand for the generation of the Holocaust, those that survived and those that did not. With his passing, we sense that that generation has almost disappeared and that soon all that will remain will be their testimonies, of which his will always have a unique standing. Wiesel's blend of belief and doubt, of questioning while clinging to Judaism and to Jewish belief, left a unique heritage and set the tone for Jewish life after the Shoah.

We will read and study selections from Elie Wiesel's writings and discuss his contributions to Jewish identity and to the world.

Course #5

Title: *The Music of Israel: From the Beginning to Today*
Instructor: Cantor Eric Schulmiller

From the Zionist musical efforts of the late 19th century up through today's diverse pop music scene, we will survey the rich history of melodies, musicians, and meaningful music produced in the land of Israel.
